



Shouts of Joy to you all around the world from our big family here in Rivers of Life Ministries in the heart of Borneo. Many months have passed since our last newsletter, more than was planned, but finally we managed to find time to get this issue done. A lot has happened again in the last six months not just here in the jungles of Borneo but around the world. I'm not sure if you have noticed but more and more of our freedoms and choice making are gradually being eroded and bit by bit taken away from us. The bizarre wokeness evidenced around the world defies all logic yet it's so alarming to see how many people are so gullible and join this trend. Banks are closing down their branches, ATM's are removed, cash & cheques frowned upon and on the way out, and there seems to be a real push to create a cashless society around the world. Ai seems to be more and more encroaching on our doorsteps and soon we will be unable to buy or sell anything without Ai. Sounds familiar? Of course, we know from scripture that these are signs of "the end times". This doesn't mean that we lose hope and become fearful but that we get ready. Not ready to hide or remove ourselves from society, like some are suggesting, but quite the opposite. We are to shine for Jesus even more so now than ever before, showing people the way that will lead to God.

Here in the jungles of Borneo amongst the many tribes Ai is also creeping in, in an alarming rate, almost forcing people to get a handphone otherwise they cannot survive and do business with anyone anymore. As we live in this time and moment now with all these new challenges, we continue to obey the Lord who commands us to: "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age". Mathew 28:19-20

Thank you to all of you who in same way or form help us to do just that, making disciples of all the tribes still considered unreached here in the remote regions on this wild island. Your wonderful support is bringing tribal people into the Kingdom of God. How awesome is that!

The vision that the Lord gave us many years ago was to prepare a place in the jungles of Borneo to house 1000 impoverished children and youth and school 2000 children. 1000 children would live 24/7 in this village and the other 1000 children would come to our schools each day but after school go home to their families and villages. Hence 21 years ago we started building this Living Waters Village on the land (jungle) the Lord showed us to purchase. Since then, many buildings have been built, such as, dozens of homes, schools, clinics, bakery, workshop, training center, worship centers, storage buildings and an immense infra-structure from roads to electricity supply and grid, water supply network, sewerage system etc. It has been an incredible journey with God, trusting Him for absolutely everything and over all those years He has never failed us.


I have noticed though that the bigger our village becomes the more complicated everything seems to become as well. Challenges and immense frustrations seem often to be the







Many of our teenagers put on a spectacular drama, playing out the many stages from when Jesus was captured in the Garden of Gethsemane till His crucifixion. Their drama was played-out from within the church building to outside, along our road (like the "Via Dolorosa" or the "road to



Golgotha") past the training center down to our graveyard where three massive crosses tower over the area. Our youth erected some small crosses there for the play. A short word from scripture was given to remind us all never to forget what Jesus went through for mankind and how the thieves who were crucified with Christ ended up in opposite eternal places.




# Mum's Fellowship:



# **Building Progress:**

Building wise much has yet again been achieved since our last newsletter. The 5 children's homes named Dina, Lewi, Ruben, Gad and Asyer are almost ready to be occupied. It has taken a lot longer than we anticipated but this is due to the enormous amount of infrastructure that had to be built around each house. Most of our buildings and roads are built on top of hills which have been levelled on top and therefor require a lot of erosion prevention. Those areas required walls made out of massive cages of galvanized wire filled with granite stones which are built up like a staircase with each cage pinned in the ground by several 4 meters long iron-wood poles. Just for these 5 houses we have used hundreds of truckloads of large granite rocks. On top of that a number of massive concrete drains were built starting on top of the hills where the roads

are built to the valley below. This also required a lot of hard work by many people to build a drain that will withstand and channel the enormous tropical downpours in order to prevent the hills being carved out and eroded away. For these 5 houses a water tower had to be built which will house 2 water tanks in order to

create enough water storage and water pressure for each house. Also, a massive concrete water tank which will hold around 100.000 litres of rain water for drinking was erected and so too a large septic tank.

Another 3 houses are also coming along really well with roofs going up, ceilings going in and tiling being done. However, for these 3 houses we also need to do a lot of erosion prevention hence hundreds of cages with granite stones and also to build a large water-tank too to catch the rainwater for drinking. Septic tanks for these houses have already been completed.

Dishonesty is a difficult sin to avoid. It is easy to cheat if we think no one is looking. But dishonesty affects the very core of a person. It makes him/her untrustworthy and untrusting. It eventually makes him/her unable to know him/herself or relate to others. Don't take dishonesty lightly. Even the smallest portion of dishonesty contains enough of the poison of deceit to kill your spiritual life. If there is any dishonesty in your life, tell God about it now.

Two of our generator sheds have been enlarged substantially and fitted with new roofs. The reason for doing this was to make the generators more accessible for service and repairs, as well as to make it easier to pull them out of their location when they need to be replaced.

Six of the twelve new High School class-rooms are ready to be used for the new school year in August. We are still waiting for the galvanized

fencing for the six new class-rooms on the top floor hence we cannot use them until that has been erected however, we will be able to use those class-rooms for storage area for the time being, something we seem to always desperately are in need of.

The five large undercover areas at the High school have all been completed now which is fabulous particularly for all those rainy days but also for educational outdoor activities during the heat of the day. An extra 40 toilets have been erected for the high school which are all operational.



The next phase for the high school is building an undercover area in the courtyard of the entire school. For us this will be another huge undertaking and challenge but difficult challenges have never phased us in the past. We always ask God for wisdom to know how to do things and how not to do them. Our projects usually take a lot longer to build but that is due to us building so many projects at the same time and, we don't have much accessibility to modern equipment to speed up construction but we get by and eventually get the job done. All our projects are built to last which require little upkeep and maintenance so that many generations of children and youth will be able to call this place home where they will be able to make something beautiful of their lives.


One of our large houses named Titus, where 30 children, youth and house parents live, is now fitted with solar panels and storage batteries. The entire electrical needs of this house is now powered by these solar panels which is absolutely awesome and amazing. All the equipment was donated by a wonderful Dutch family who run a small solar business in Holland. We were able to bring all the equipment in a container, and the owner of the business, a lovely brother in the Lord, even came to our village here with a friend and helped to install everything, while at the same time teaching our guys how to install and maintain such a project. We hope that this is a first of many such projects which will substantially cut our diesel consumption for our generators.

Funds were received from some fantastic sponsors to be able to buy 4 new generators that desperately needed replacing. The gifts were initially going to help us to purchase all 4 generators but after doing a bit of research re which generators we should buy this time, we found that most brands which were trusted for decades are now no longer manufactured in those countries where once high quality and performance were the most important aspect of their brand. Now their brands are manufactured in countries with low quality standards and their quality and performance have substantially eroded. Why any trusted brand would want to do that is beyond me. We have tried a number of

brands over the 20 years since Living Water Village exists and have experienced ourselves precise that decline in quality. However, some trusted brands still produce good, reliable, high quality and high-performance generators in their original country but, the prices are more than twice the cost of these other ones. Still, research tells us that if you are using a generator every day, which we do, you are better off in the long run to have reliable, high-quality generators as their life span is anywhere around 20 years but a low quality one will only last for 3-5 years if you use them every day. Hence, for us it makes therefor more sense then, to buy the more expensive, high quality, high performance, economical machines which are really cheaper in the long-run. And so, we have purchased 2 new generators manufactured entirely in Japan and so too all its components. They are now on the way as we speak and they should arrive in the next few months which will be a fantastic blessing. But it does mean then that we still need to purchase 2 more generators. Please pray with us that the 2 purchased new machines will arrive speedily and that funds will arrive for another 2 generators so that our electricity supply won't be disrupted in this village, which is really now a small town, in the middle of the jungle. A huge thank you to those wonderful people who already gave generously to buy the first 2 generators. Really fantastic.



Every day has 24 hours filled with opportunities to grow, serve, and be productive. Yet it is so easy to waste time, letting live slip from our grasp. Refuse to be a lazy person, sleeping or frittering away the hours meant for productive work. See time as God's gift, and seize your opportunities to live diligently for Him. The world says to hold on to as much as possible, but God blesses those who give freely of their possessions, time, and energy. When we give, God supplies us with more so that we can give more. In addition, giving helps us gain a right perspective on our possessions. We realize they were never really ours to begin with, but they were given to us by God to be used to help others. What then do we gain by giving? Freedom from enslavement to our possessions, the joy of helping others, and God's approval.

- 6. To provide opportunities for teams from various denominations around the world to taste and experience "hands on missions". (Equipping the church with "Doers").




Our Siko showing off literally 'fruit for his labour'. We had a fantastic crop of rambutan fruit this season enjoyed by all for many months.
