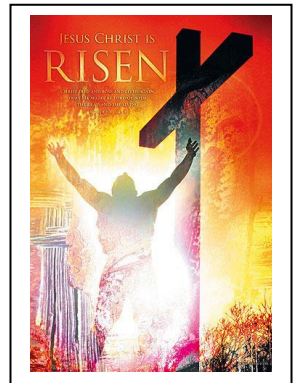


Our children are always happy to have their photo taken. Here just a few who could fit on a close-up photo.

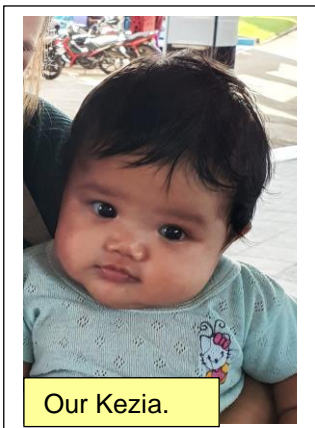
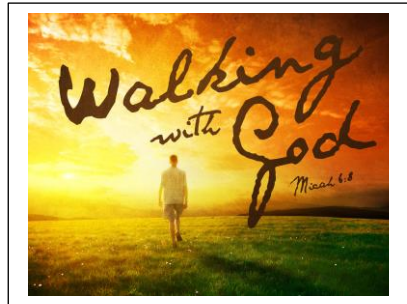
Our Repa.

Also our Elisabet, wife of our Yosep, gave birth to a beautiful daughter named Shine. Both mum and daughter are doing great.

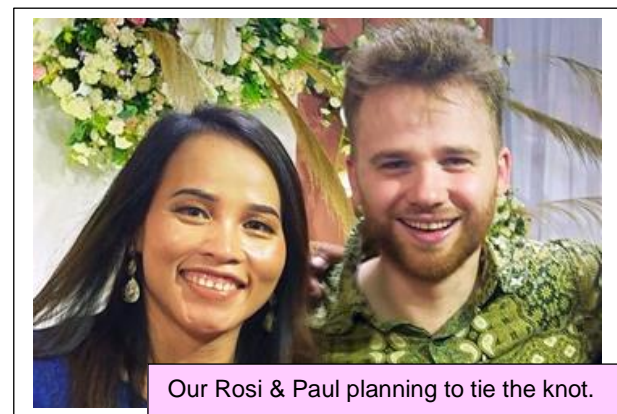

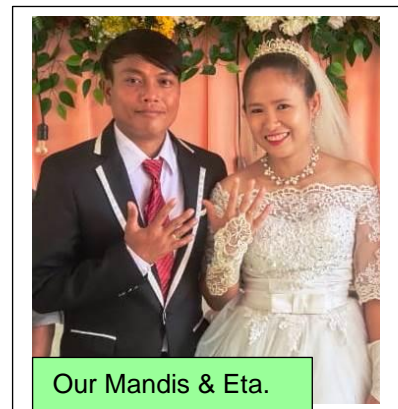

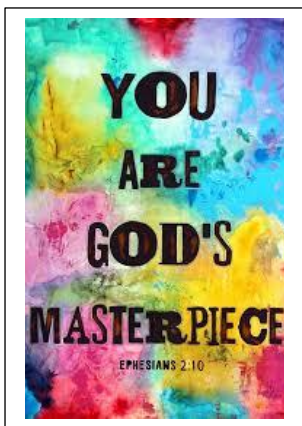
Our Mandis married our Eta. They had their wedding in Eta's village and had a wonderful day. Only a

Some of you may still remember when we found Mandis about 23 years ago in his village called Koli which belongs to the Matee tribe. As you can see on the photo, left, he was in a bad shape. His father had just recently died and his mother was not able to care for all her children as she was mentally unstable. We noticed that Mandis was rather neglected, severely malnourished and looked ill so we asked his mother and the tribal chief if they thought it was a good idea that he came to stay with us so that we could help him get back to health again. They both agreed and so Mandis came to live with us. We quickly discovered at a health check-up that his kidneys had issues. We took him to a kidney specialist who performed a biopsy on his kidneys to determine how bad his kidneys were. After two weeks we received the results and it was bad news. His kidneys were barely working and really needed a kidney transplant, but this wasn't possible at the time. The doctor prescribed some medicine and a diet to stick to, but he said it was just a matter of time before his kidneys would fail. I communicated Mandis's situation in our newsletter and asked people to pray. As a result, many people have been praying for years. One day a sister in the Lord in a small town in Australia called



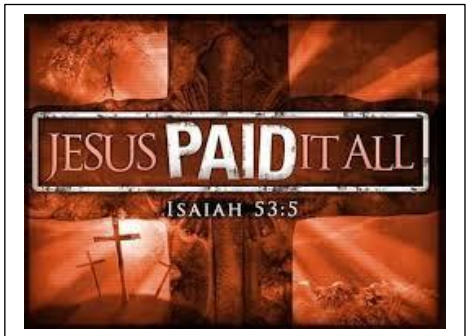

Benalla, stepped forward in a church service and asked for prayer on behalf of Mandis. God touched her in such an incredible way that day, that she knew that Mandis was healed, and indeed Mandis was healed. God had done a wonderful miracle in his life by giving him new kidneys. The kidney specialist confirmed after examination that these were not the same kidneys as before. He said, "Mandis is a walking miracle" - and that he is. He now shares his testimony; how God has healed him miraculously to whoever he bumps into. What a wonderful God we serve.

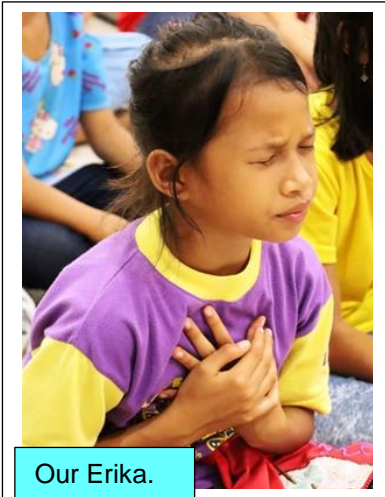

All people die physically, but Christ died so that we would not have to die spiritually. We can have wonderful confidence in His saving work for us, doing away with sin – past, present and future. He has forgiven our past sin – when He died on the cross, He sacrificed himself once for all; He has given us the Holy Spirit to help us deal with present sin; He appears before God for us now in heaven; and He promises to return and raise us to eternal life in a world where sin will be banished.

Reaching out to the needy in our communities:

It has been a busy time yet again reaching out to the needy. There seems to be so many people in dire need that it's difficult to know where to start, who to help first, where to go. We always ask the Lord to show us and let us know who to help and how, since there is only so much that you can do. Our resources at Living Waters Village are always stretched to the limit, but because we all fast a meal each Friday afternoon, we are able to use the money we save from those 800 meals to help as many needy people as possible in the community. One of our pastors, Pastor Toher, is the one who has taken this ministry of Diakonia under his care. He takes several of our people, young and old,

around the region to see who we can help, and as a result comes across very disturbing situations. Food is distributed to the many hungry who are unable to work due to their illness or lack of work, which is scarce around the area. Funds are distributed to

individuals or families to buy urgent medicines or medical treatments.

One mother, Ibu Nurlela ended up at our place with a shocking foot already rotting away as a result of diabetic neglect as you can see on the photo above left. To spare her life her foot needed to be amputated but she had no money to do this. We were able to provide her with the funds for the operation as well as getting her on insulin so that she will be able to live with her diabetes. Of course we had to teach her what diet was important for her and the need to stick to it. She is staying here with us now and quite enjoying it although she is homesick to her village and garden.



A while ago we helped another guy, Eddy (left), who needed his foot amputated due to a rare infection but had no money to do this. He was refused treatment at the local hospital because he had no money so they sent him home. It is hard to believe that someone in such a condition is totally neglected. He too would have died if he didn't get his leg amputated. Thankfully we were able to help him. Praise the Lord he is doing fine now, learning to live with one leg but grateful that he is still alive.



Caring only for your physical needs while ignoring your relationship with God will only lead to ruin.

When things are going well, we feel elated. When hardships come, we sink into depression. But true joy transcends the rolling waves of circumstance. Joy comes from a consistent relationship with Jesus Christ. When our lives are intertwined with His, He will help us walk through adversity without sinking into debilitating lows and manage prosperity without moving into deceptive highs. 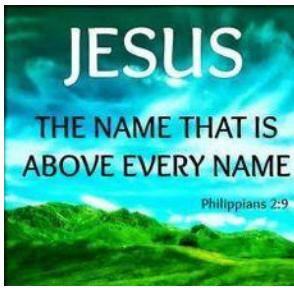

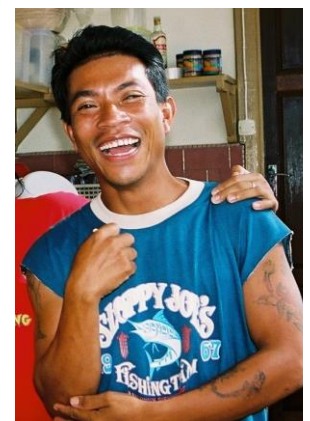

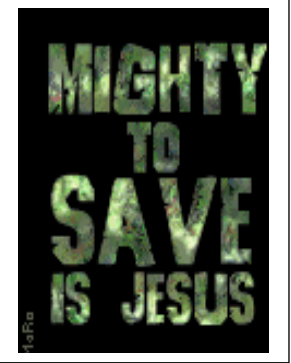

Sometimes I wonder whether we have started too much at once, but then again all the current projects are really urgent in order to help with the continuous influx of new children arriving. But praise the Lord, progress is being made and projects do get finished, but only so we can then start on the next one. It seems that the bigger our village becomes the bigger the projects become. But it is all very exciting to see more buildings and infra-structure finished and immediately used, enlarging His Kingdom. What an awesome God we serve.



Ezra house and Nehemiah house are now complete and have become a home for house parents and their families as well as a whole stack of children. And boy do they love it. It's so good to see how well they get on with each other and how a home built on the solid rock (Jesus) will prosper, immersing in The Word of God, learning Biblical values and principles, together with love which becomes the building blocks for shaping and forming their character and personality. It is truly a miracle to see many of these children, who have come from broken, loveless homes, now thriving, happy and such a blessing for everyone around them. Only the Holy Spirit can do that. Of course He often uses people to achieve His goal but He is the one pulling the strings if we allow Him through our faith and obedience.

David house and Jonathan house are almost finished. Most likely when you receive this newsletter both houses will already be occupied which is such a blessing. These houses are smaller but still can house 8-12 children & youth each with house parents. That will certainly alleviate some of the pressure off the Training Centre building which has become a bit overcrowded.

The 12-classroom high school building is coming along great. The first floor is almost done and now scaffolding for the next floor level will be started soon. Of course we have a long way to go still but it is wonderful to see the progress being made.

The primary school building ceilings are finished but still much has to be done on this huge project. Extra class rooms have been created between various buildings to increase our class room capacity. A lot of work also has to be done on the school grounds. The entire



primary school is built, like most of our buildings, on a shaved off hill. The school grounds slope in all directions, hence we want to level the entire area out to make it more usable for school activities. It is already fenced off which is a huge blessing, but requires quite a lot more to make it suitable. We also need kindergarten playground equipment which will be under cover to protect it from the harsh scorching tropical sun, and fenced off for the little ones' protection. Hence still a long way to go but we are slowly getting there, praise the Lord.

Are you a refreshing influence on others, or do your attitude and temperament add to the burden they carry? Instead of draining others' energy and motivation with complaints and problems, replenish their spirits by encouragement, love, and a helpful attitude.

Our last newsletter was in early December before Christmas. Since then, of course we have had our Christmas celebrations which was fantastic. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed all the festivities. 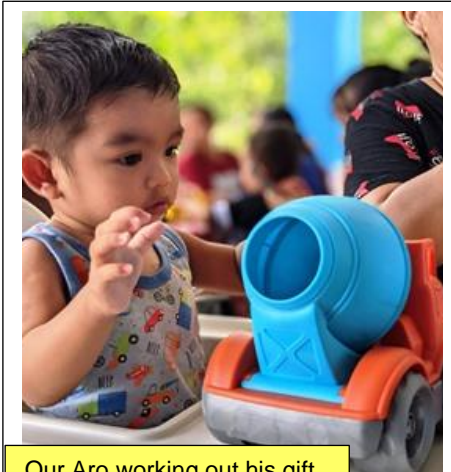

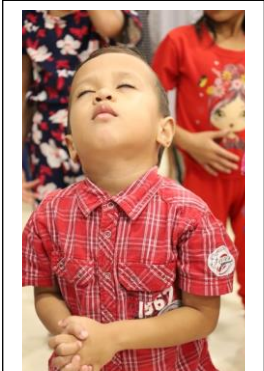

Graduations:

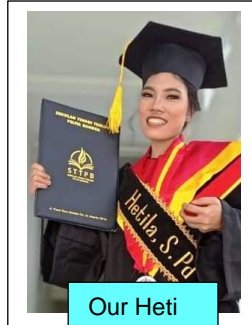

Just a reminder:

We are so grateful to all those people who send us financial gifts for the Lord's work here. These gifts/sponsorship payments are collected by our national trusts/offices in various countries whom are mostly volunteers, and they do a wonderful job getting these funds to us each month. Each month we receive the lists of the various donors with the amounts they have given. Although we would like to email a personal acknowledgement each time we receive a gift, it is almost impossible for us to do so. We would need to have a full-time administrator to do just that task, which we don't have. We do try to send a few acknowledgements each month but only if we have the time. Some banks however, don't give us the full information because of **'the privacy act'**. Hence, we may receive a surname and amount but no address details, therefore we don't always know which person it is who sent the gift.

In the UK we only receive a letter from our trust with the total amount received for the month. **The privacy act** there does not allow our trust in the UK to pass on any details of our sponsors or amounts they gave so it is impossible for us to write an acknowledgement to our sponsors that we received their gift. Only the trust can acknowledge that. We find this rather strange and rather disappointing. Even gifts for us personally we are not allowed to know who the sponsor is. **Only** if you directly email us, to let us know that you have sent a gift to our trust, will we know who it is. So, we do apologise if you haven't received a thank you from us as a ministry or personally. Rest assured though, your gifts are all used wisely, appropriately and according to designation. On behalf of everyone here in our village a huge thank you to all of you for your understanding and wonderful input into the Lord's work here.
